COMPREHENSIVE CABIN CLOSING CHECKLIST

	Remove perishable food and garbage Store grains and seeds in metal containers with screw-on lids Store your dry food in a tin or aluminum-lined cupboard Clean out the fridge and freezer and leave doors slightly ajar Wash containers and put away soap and sponges Remove bottled liquids Spray insecticide Place insect traps under the sink and on kitchen counters
Plumbing & Electricity	
	Pull out the water line from the lake Cover toilet bowl with saran wrap Pour antifreeze or kerosene down sinks and toilets Follow the manufacturer's directions for electric dishwashers and washing machines Shut off power at the main switch and unplug electrical devices if you don't have an alarm in place Leave on the thermostat if you keep the electricity on Have a humidistat installed in damp weather Turn off gas hot-water heaters completely
General	
	Use high-quality locks Stop your mail deliveries Leave nothing outdoors Wash and store bedding and towels in a tight or rodent-proof box like your meat lug Cover any furniture that you are leaving behind with dust covers Use mothballs and mouse traps throughout the perimeter Check all windows and doors for gaps or cracks and seal them with weatherstripping or caulk Store all outdoor equipment in a secure and dry location Store your firewood in a sturdy box Take photos or videos of your cabin's interior and exterior
	Do a final walk-through of your cabin to ensure that everything is properly secured and stored

Lock up your cabin and enjoy peace of mind knowing that it's properly closed for the winter season.
